ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On July 6, 2007 an Order to Show Cause Why an Order to Cease and Desist Unsafe Practices Should Not Issue, Notice of Hearing, and Appointment of Hearing Officer (“Order to Show Cause”) was issued to Ronald W. Courcy (“Respondent”) based on information that Respondent had undertaken activities for which a license was required under R.I. Gen. Laws § 42-14.2-3. A prehearing conference was held on August 8, 2007 at which Respondent admitted that he had eighty six (86) vehicles on his property and that he would take deliberate actions to remove those vehicles.


On December 12, 2007 a status conference was held at which time Respondent represented that he still had seventy (70) vehicles on the property and that he would continue to remove vehicles. Respondent also agreed to send in weekly updates on his progress to the Department in lieu of attending monthly status conferences. On March 4, 2008 a status conference was held at which Respondent indicated that he had been removing vehicles, however, there were still seventy-six (76) vehicles on the property. The count had increased because overgrowth on the property had been concealing some vehicles. He was ordered to continue to remove vehicles and provide weekly status updates to the department.

On July 16, 2008 a status conference was held. The Department personnel who had inspected the property reported that there were still between fifty (50) and sixty (60) vehicles on the property. Respondent agreed to continue removing vehicles and to continue to inform the Department of the status of his efforts. On April 27, 2009 a status conference was held in which Respondent reported that while he had been removing vehicles there were still forty-three (43) vehicle on the property. The hearing officer issued an order that if all remaining vehicles were not removed by August 25, 2009 she would entertain a request for a per day fine.

On August 25, 2009 a status conference was held in which it was reported that only seven (7) vehicles were left on the property. An order was issued indicating that the parties would work together to resolve all outstanding issues and inform the hearing officer as to whether a hearing would be necessary. On November 9, 2009 the hearing officer was informed by email that an inspection of the premises had revealed that all vehicles had been removed and the clean up had been completed.

Based on the foregoing, the Hearing Officer respectfully recommends that the above-captioned matter be dismissed.
