**DISMISSAL ORDER**


The above-entitled matter came on for pre-hearing conference on June 23, 2009 pursuant to the Department of Business Regulation's ("Department") Order to Show Cause and Notice of Hearing ("Notice") issued by the Department on June 2, 2009 to the above-captioned respondent ("Respondent"). At the pre-hearing conference, the parties agreed to the following order being entered:

A temporary cease and desist order is entered against the Respondent in that the Respondent shall not engage any unlicensed automobile body work and shall comply with R.I. Gen. Laws § 5-38-1 *et seq.* (automobile body shop).

Since then the Department represents that the Respondent represented to the Department that he chose not to pursue licensing so would work with someone else. The Respondent had been engaged in automobile body repair work at 101 Commercial Way, East Providence, RI. The Department has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws § 5-38-1 *et seq.*


In light of the above, the undersigned recommends that this matter be dismissed.

SUCH APPEAL, IF TAKEN, MUST BE COMPLETED BY FILING A PETITION FOR REVIEW IN SUPERIOR COURT. THE FILING OF THE COMPLAINT DOES NOT ITSELF STAY ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDER. THE AGENCY MAY GRANT, OR THE REVIEWING COURT MAY ORDER, A STAY UPON THE APPROPRIATE TERMS.**
