**CONSENT ORDER**

It is hereby agreed by and between the Department of Business Regulation (“Department”) and Wolf Rock Wine and Spirits, Inc. (“Respondent”) as follows:

1. On October 6, 2015, the Director of the Department of Business Regulation (“Department”) issued an Order to Show Cause Why License Should Not Be Revoked or Suspended, or Administrative Penalty Imposed, Appointment of Hearing Officer, and Notice of Pre-hearing Conference (“Order to Show Cause”) to the Respondent. The Order to Show Cause is attached as Exhibit #1 hereto.<sup>1</sup>
2. Other than the allegations in the Order to Show Cause, the Respondent has a clean liquor license disciplinary history.
3. The Respondents represents that it voluntarily took the following measures to improve prevention of alcohol sales to underage individuals: The Respondent acquired an ID scanner. In addition, the Respondent has posted copies of their carding policies at each register station and each employee is required to sign a copy of the policies, agreeing that they have read them and will adhere to them. Further, all

employees hired as cashiers are required to take the alcohol server training certification course and are not allowed to serve customers until they are so certified.

4. To effect a timely and amicable resolution of this matter, the Respondent hereby agrees to:

A. Serve a liquor license suspension of two (2) days on January 2nd and January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017.

B. Pay a total administrative penalty of \$4,000, payable to "General Treasurer, State of Rhode Island."

C. Continue to use age verification ID scanning technology that is equipped to detect fake ID cards in accordance with reasonable policies and procedures.

5. Respondent voluntarily waives any right to an administrative hearing and appeal to Superior Court under the Rhode Island Administrative Procedures Act, R.I. Gen. Laws § 42-35-1 *et seq.*

6. If Respondent fails to abide by the requirements of this Consent Agreement, the Department may initiate further administrative proceedings against the Respondent.




